

About DACA

On September 5, 2017, the Trump Administration announced an end to the DACA program.

If your DACA work permit expires between September 5, 2017 and March 5, 2018, you should renew your DACA by October 5, 2017.

If you are ready to renew:

We recommend bringing these items with you:

- Copy of work permit or copy of I-765 approval notice
- Previously filed DACA application
 \$495 filing fee (see
- \$495 ming fee (see seattle.gov/DACA for loan options)
- 2 passport pictures

Important Things to Know About DACA

1. Your DACA is valid until its expiration date.

DACA and work permits (Employment Authorization Document) will remain valid until its expiration date. **It does not automatically end on September 5, 2017.** To see when your DACA and work permit expires, look at your I-795 Approval Notice and the bottom of your Employment Authorization Document.

2. No new DACA applications will be accepted.

If you do not already have DACA, DO NOT FILE A NEW APPLICATION!

3. You can apply for a renewal ONLY if your DACA work permit is due to expire between now and March 5, 2018. **Deadline to apply: October 5, 2017.**

After renewals, DACA lasts for two years. Please submit your renewal as soon as possible. It needs to be received by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) by October 5, 2017. We recommend you get legal assistance. For free legal clinics, please see the list of events on this flyer or go to <u>seattle.gov/DACA</u> for new events.

4. Advance Parole to travel abroad is no longer available.

If you are planning to travel outside the U.S. under advance parole, we recommend you get legal assistance. If you have not already applied for advance parole, DHS stated that they will not grant advance parole under DACA after September 5, 2017.
