Item 1. The following is a list of questions received and SHA's responses to those questions.

<u>Question 1.</u> For building 2850- Steve counted 5 wallpacks instead of the listed 4 and he also saw 1 floodlight on the west side of the exterior. We want to verify that all 5 wallpacks will be replaced as well as the floodlight.

<u>Response:</u> Contractors should bid the advertised lighting schedule titled Telemark Apartments. 2850 NW 56th St.

<u>Question 2.</u> For Build 3290 The Garage strip light are recessed. Do we want to maintain recessed profile or surface mount?

<u>Response:</u> There currently is no lighting schedule for an SHA building with an address 3290. However, we are assuming this question is intended for the advertised lighting schedule title Michaelson Manor, 320 W Roy St. Contractors should bid the advertised lighting schedule titled Michaelson Manor, 320 W Roy St.

Question 3. Is there an obligation to touch up any paint?.

<u>Response:</u> Attachment B.1, Volume 2, General Requirements and Technical Specifications states, repair and patch-back of wall, ceiling, siding, and other surfaces that are impacted by the contractor while performing this work.

Question 4. Can you please confirm when the bid opening is and send the Microsoft link?

Section 3 Benchmarks for Creating Economic Opportunities for Low- and Very Low-Income Persons and Eligible Businesses

<u>Background:</u> As a condition to receiving financial assistance from HUD, the Seattle Housing Authority (SHA) is required to report to HUD the number of hours worked by Section 3 workers and Targeted Section 3 workers on SHA's contracts. To gather that information, SHA is requiring all firms contracting with SHA to track their Section 3 hours and to submit to SHA a quarterly report. SHA created a form (see the back of this page) for all contractors and consultants to use for this quarterly report.

HUD requires SHA and its contractors to use their best efforts to achieve the following Section 3 benchmarks:

<u>For Section 3 Workers</u> - 25 percent or more of the total number of labor hours worked by all workers employed with public housing financial assistance for SHA's fiscal year.

<u>For Targeted Section 3 Workers</u> - 5 percent or more of the total number of labor hours worked by all workers employed with public housing financial assistance for SHA's fiscal year.

Definitions:

<u>Section 3 worker</u>. A Section 3 worker is any worker who currently fits, or when hired within the past five years fit, at least one of the following categories, as documented:

- 1. The worker's income for the previous or annualized calendar year is below the income limit established by HUD;
- 2. The worker is employed by a Section 3 business concern; or
- 3. The worker is a YouthBuild participant.

<u>Targeted Section 3 worker</u>: A Targeted Section 3 Worker is a Section 3 worker who:

- 1. Is employed by a Section 3 business concern; or
- 2. Currently fits or when hired fit at least one of the following categories, as documented within the past five years:
 - a. A resident of public housing or Section 8-assisted housing;
 - A resident of other public housing projects or Section 8-assisted housing managed by SHA; or A YouthBuild participant

<u>Section 3 Business Concern</u>: A Section 3 business concern is a business that meets at least one of the following criteria, documented within the last six-month period:

- 1. At least 51 percent owned and controlled by low- or very low-income persons;
- 2. Over 75 percent of the labor hours performed for the business over the prior threemonth period are performed by Section 3 workers; or
- 3. A business at least 51 percent owned and controlled by current public housing residents or residents who currently live in Section 8-assisted housing
