SHA works with community partners to target subsidy into special programs serving homeless families and individuals.

3,813 Units committed for homeless families and individuals

Special programs include:

2,040 Vouchers dedicated to permanent supportive housing (PSH) to house the chronically homeless

569 Vouchers dedicated to housing homeless veterans

37 Homeless families with children at Bailey Gatzert Elementary permanently housed near the school through the Home from School pilot
