**3,602** Units committed for service-enriched housing for homeless families and individuals

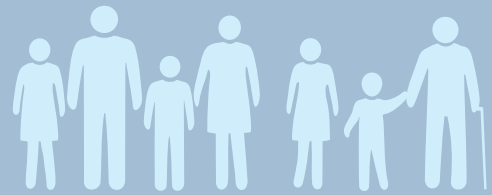
Special programs include:

**380** Vouchers dedicated to housing homeless veterans

**180** Vouchers dedicated to a Family Unification Program to prevent family separation as a result of homelessness

**16** Homeless families with children at Bailey Gatzert Elementary permanently housed near the school through the Home from School pilot
