The undersigned acknowledges and certifies that above company meets the minority/women owned business enterprise certification requirements as defined in Washington Administrative Code (WAC) Chapters 326-02 and 326-20, and hereby summarized below:

- 1. To be considered an eligible owner, you must be a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident **and** a member of one of the following groups:
 - \circ Woman
 - Black origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa
 - **Hispanic** Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish or Portuguese culture or origin, regardless of race
 - American Indian/Alaskan Native origins in any of the original peoples of North America
 - **Asian American** origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian Subcontinent or the Pacific Islands

- 2. Eligible owner must own at least 51% of the business.
 - Ownership percentages are not rounded. 50.99% ownership will not be rounded up to 51% ownership.
 - Because Washington is a community property state, a business owned by a husband and wife is automatically deemed to be owned 50% by the husband and 50% by the wife.
- 3. Eligible owner must control the company's managerial and day-to-day operations. He/she must have both the legal authority and technical ability to control the company. If the State of Washington requires a professional license to perform the company's line of work, the eligible owner must hold this license, even if the owner is not the one performing the work.
- 4. Company must be an independent business, organized for profit, and legally licensed to do business in Washington.
- 5. Company must perform a "Commercially Useful Function". A "commercially useful function" is a real and actual service that is central and necessary to complete the product or service.

The undersigned has completed the checklist on page two identifying status of its firm. The undersigned acknowledges SHA's rights to require the submission of additional information for purposes of verifying proof of ownership and eligibility status.
