

# Yesler Terrace Redevelopment Feedback Summary Workshop 3 | Jobs – Business Development October 1, 2008

On October 1, 2008 a public Workshop was held for residents of Yesler Terrace in the Community Center.

This workshop focused on jobs and business development possibilities in the future Yesler Terrace. Tom Hudson led a virtual tour of possible jobs and businesses in the future Yesler Terrace. Five questions were presented at the end of the presentation and discussed in language groups. This report serves as a record of the residents' discussions.

# **Presentation summary**

Tom Hudson presented different business concepts and opportunities that could be possible in the future Yesler Terrace. He led a virtual tour of possible jobs opportunities in Yesler Terrace based upon examples from around the world. The presentation highlighted job opportunities, such as food production, food retail, day care, education and art & crafts just to name a few. He also offered ideas about possible uses of current buildings, for example, the steam plant could be used as a café, commercial kitchen or for food processing. A public plaza could be a place for a public market, festivals and other community events. After his visual presentation the residents discussed the following questions in their language groups:

- 5. How could redevelopment of Yesler Terrace assist in reducing these barriers?




# **Yesler Terrace Redevelopment**

- Grocery store.


# 4) As a Yesler Terrace resident, what are the barriers to the job(s) you want (are interested in)?

- It would increased accessibility.


- I am too old and sick. I don't need to do anything.

- Nail shop.




- Starbucks or similar.

- Past redevelopment has no grocery (High Point), closure of SCC Satellite at New Holly is not reassuring.





- Housekeeping/cleaning.







• Fast food, food-to-go.


### 3) What business would you like to start or be a part of in Yesler Terrace?

# 4) As a Yesler Terrace resident, what are the barriers to the job(s) you want (are interested in)?


#### Korean:

- 5) How could redevelopment of Yesler Terrace assist in reducing these barriers?


- A shop where residents can demonstrate how to make traditional handmade crafts and a place to sell those crafts (serving trays, jewelry, decorations).
- Farmer's market.
- Outdoor space for children to play with a guardian, somewhat like a lifeguard on a beach, someone to watch, but not a structured daycare.
- Church.
- An exercise facility.
- A coffee shop that contains traditional coffee and one where customers can experience a traditional Etrurian coffee ceremony.



- Alterations store.

- Drycleaner with an adjacent Laundromat with large capacity washers and dryers for cleaning comforters.
- Corner store.

- Language barrier, they would like to learn English in order to conduct the businesses they would like
- Little transit options

# 5) How could redevelopment of Yesler Terrace assist in reducing these barriers?

 A Yesler Terrace transit center or transit system would help residents get around the neighborhood easily. An idea of a trolley type of bus line that circles the center of the neighborhood was suggested. This circle would be blocked off to cars allowing maximum pedestrian activity.
